## **COVID-19 Changes to Health Program Benefits**

The following changes are in place for benefits program pursuant to state or federal action on COVID-19 and will, for the most part, end after the emergency has passed. However, Coloradans' experience with these measures may provide a basis for more permanent change. Additional changes will be added if approved under Section 1115 waiver authority, a state plan amendment, or federal legislation.
